

Sara is currently a postdoctoral researcher at the Cognitive Neuroscience Laboratory. With a background in linguistics, she received a PhD at the University of Udine with a thesis on Neurolinguistics, where she investigated discourse abilities in patients with fluent aphasia. After her PhD she moved to the University of Nova Gorica (Slovenia) first, where she was involved in a project funded by the European Commission aimed at investigating the pragmatic and syntactical aspects of linguistic processing in the bilingual population, from children to adults. Then, she obtained a research fellowship at the International School for Advanced Studies (SISSA, Trieste), in a project granted by the Foundation “Human Frontier Science Program”, for which she conducted experiments investigating the relationship between language and memory applied to poetry. She is now back in Udine where she pursues her research interests: in particular, she works on narrative analysis in healthy aging, but she’s also interested in developing diagnostic tools for clinical population, especially for people with aphasia in their different profiles.
