

Andrea Marini is Full Professor of Cognitive Psychology at the University of Udine (Italy), where he teaches Psychology of Language and Cognitive and Social Neuroscience. He is board member of the PhD school in Cognitive Neuroscience at the University of Trieste (Italy). he also teaches at the University of Roma Tre and the Catholic University. He served on the working group for the Italian Consensus Conference on Primary Language Disorder. He was Visiting Professor at East Carolina University (USA) and representative for Italy in the EU COST Action (Horizon 2020 Program): IS1406, Enhancing children's oral language skills across Europe and beyond. Since 2006 he has been Principal Investigator or Research Unit Coordinator of Research Projects funded by the Ministry of Health collaborating with IRCCS "Santa Lucia" and "Eugenio Medea" and with the Provincial School of Health "Claudiana" in Bolzano. Editorial director of the series "Neuroscience, Psychology, Education" of Carocci publisher in Rome, Italy. Dr. Marini has been invited speaker at more than 250 domestic and international conferences. He is the author of more than 160 publications including books (e.g., "Manuale di Neurolinguistica" Carocci), diagnostic tools (e.g., the BVL_4-12, Giunti), book chapters and scientific articles in international journals. He currently appears in 2nd place for number of citations in the category "Clinical Linguistics" and 3rd place in the categories "Aphasiology" and "Neuropsychology of Language" (Source: Google Scholar).
